



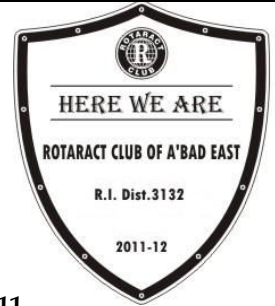

#### **Description**
